

RESOLUTION NO. 304

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING REGULATIONS AND
CHARGES FOR THE USE OF DISTRICT FIRE HYDRANTS AND
RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 242

WHEREAS Lake Forest Park Water District of King County has fire hydrants within its boundaries for fire flow purposes, and

WHEREAS from time to time it is necessary for individuals, companies or contracting firms to draw water from these hydrants for specific jobs or projects, and

WHEREAS Lake Forest Park Water District Board of Commissioners has determined it necessary that regulations be developed for use of the District fire hydrants.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Lake Forest Park Water District that

Section 1. No use of Lake Forest Park Water District fire hydrants shall be allowed unless a proper permit as issued by the District manager has been obtained. There shall be a fine of \$500.00 each time a connection is made to a fire hydrant without the required permit.

Section 2. Before issuing a permit for water draw from a hydrant, the District manager shall have received from the requesting party, an application for use of the District fire hydrant, either in writing or verbal request.

Section 3. At the time the District receives an application or request for hydrant use, the applicant shall submit a deposit for the water draw meter as well as a \$25.00 permit fee. No applicant shall use a meter other than the Lake Forest Park Water District water draw meters for water from the hydrants.

Section 4. The following fees will be in effect for use of the Lake Forest Park Water District hydrants:

- a. one - inch meter deposit: \$150.00
- b. two – inch meter deposit: \$600.00
- c. Meter rental (all sizes) : \$20.00 per day (but not to exceed \$200.00 per month)
- d. Water usage charge : Current District retail rate

Any damages to the District rental meters shall be paid by the applicant in addition to the above fees.

Section 5. A consumption log will be carried in all water hauling trucks, at all times, and will be kept current with actual draw.

Section 6. All water hauling trucks will be inspected annually for proper backflow prevention and will be put on a designated list.

Section 7. That Resolution Number 242 be and is hereby rescinded.
